- · Successful completion of Literacy requirement
- 40 hours of community involvement
- 30 credits required for graduation: (18 compulsory and 12 optional)
  - 4 English, one per grade level
  - 1 French as a second language
  - 3 Mathematics, at least one in Grade 11 or 12
- 2 Science
- 1 Canadian geography
- 1 Canadian history
- 1 Arts (dance, drama, media, music, visual arts)
- 1 Health and physical education
- 0.5 Civics
- 0.5 Career studies

# NOTE Community 40 HOURS - DON'T WAIT!

#### COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

Students are required to complete a minimum of 40 hours of mandatory Community Involvement prior to graduation.

- An indication of completion will be entered on the student's Ontario Student Transcript when the 40 hours have been submitted and
- Secondary school staff will discuss appropriate types of Community Involvement activities and projects with students and may offer suggestions, but the selection and management of the involvement is to be directed by the student.
- The Toronto District School Board publishes a list of "approved" and "non-approved" activities; students choosing an activity not on the approved list must apply for permission in writing to the school Principal.
- · Activities may take place inside or outside the school. If inside, activities may not be part of a credit program.
- The student may not displace a worker who would normally have been paid to perform the same function or receive pay.
- Community Involvement hours cannot begin until September, Grade 9.

## ONTARIO SECONDARY SCHOOL LITERACY REQUIREMENT

In the spring of their Grade 10 school year, students will write an Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT), which is created and marked by the Ministry of Education and Training.

- Students who pass the test have fulfilled the Literacy requirement.
- Students who have been eligible to write the OSSLT and who have been unsuccessful at least once are eligible to take the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Course (OLC4O). Students who successfully complete this course will have met the provincial literacy requirement for graduation. and will earn one credit. (see page 49 for more information).






#### **TRANSFER COURSES**
