Claude Watson Arts Program

and our extensive arts program taught by skilled teachers and guest artists. Our students perform in provincial, national, and international competitions.

Enrichment Program

We offer an enrichment program in English, Math, Social Sciences, and Science from grades 9 to 11. Those courses provide you with additional challenges and opportunities for independent learning, in addition to expanding your critical and analytical thinking skills.



Student Success Program

This program is focused on assisting students who require additional intensive support by providing learning skills, credit recovery, and peer tutoring support. We help students develop good study skills to use in their courses.

Our Intervention Program supports students by focusing on the development of team building skills and cooperation as well as credit rescue.



Experiential Learning Opportunities Year (ELOY)

ELOY is an enrichment program designed for students who have completed four years of high school. There are four components to the program: real world work connections, additional high school courses, post-secondary study, and an option for travel.

The program will set students up for success after high school and allow exploration of new avenues of interest.

Our students have great opportunities to develop leadership skills and have fun. We offer more than 75 clubs and councils, as well as 35 sports teams. Students help to organize our fashion show, dance nights, art show, coffee house, and zoom film festival. They perform or attend our music showcase, one-act plays, symphony and jazz nights. Our atheltic program offers a wide range from traditional sports to specialized activities such as rugby, martial arts training, golf, boys' and girls' hockey, and ultimate frisbee.

Our intensive extra-curricular learning programs heighten awareness, appreciation and concern for global issues and the environment. Enriched overseas experiences are available for travel to other countries and we host international students through exchange programs to increase their understanding and awareness of global issues.

Cultural and arts studies are offered on our annual trips to greece, Italy, and New York. We have established international connections with China, England, France, Holland, Hong Kong, Korea, Japan, Mexico, and Taiwan.

Our school has an excellent reputation in Toronto. We help students create their future. Over 95 per cent of our students are accepted into the university of their choice. We have expanded our co-operative education program, developing partnerships to respond to our students' interests.
