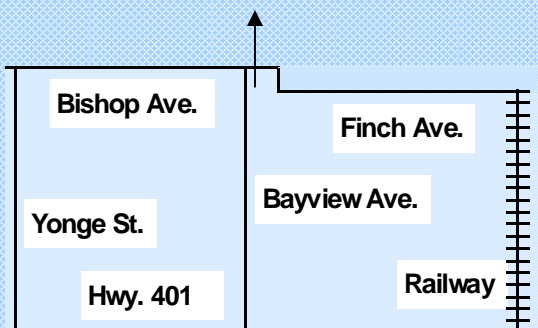


Earl Haig S.S. School Boundaries

* **Excluding all newly constructed residential units**

- **North Boundary** - the hydro electric power corridor on the north side of Finch Ave. E. between Yonge St. and Bayview Ave., and Finch Ave. E. between Bayview Ave. and the CNR tracks on the west side of Leslie St.
- **South Boundary** – Hwy. 401 between Yonge St. and the CNR tracks on the west side of Leslie St.
- **East Boundary** – the CNR tracks on the west side of Leslie St. between Finch Ave. E. and Hwy 401.
- **West Boundary** – Yonge St. (odd numbers only) between the hydro electric power corridor on the north side of Finch Ave. E. and Hwy 401.

Registration Check List for New Students

All students registering for Earl Haig Secondary School **must provide** the following:

- Notarized** copies of Purchase, Lease or Rental Agreement
- 2 billing notices (i.e. phone/gas/cable/bank statement), or work order/landline
- Citizenship Identification/Landed Immigrant Papers
- Legal Guardianship Papers (if applicable)
- Immunization Information
- Latest report or transcript or school papers from previous country (translated)
- Results of the Gr. 10 Literacy Test (if applicable)
- Student Registration Form
- OSR Transfer Form
- Medical Form
- If you are newly arrived to the country, or have not attended a TDSB school within 1 year, you must go to Georges Vanier Reception Centre (416-395-9440) for an evaluation and then bring your assessment form to the Guidance Office.
- Obtain and deliver to the Guidance Office the first 6 items on the above list. Once your registration package is complete the Guidance Office will contact you with an appointment date and time.

This brochure contains the Board approved recommendations of the Area Review Committee to reduce enrolment at Earl Haig Secondary School.

Please read carefully as this brochure contains data vital to every student's right to attend.

EARL HAIG SECONDARY SCHOOL REGISTRATION PROCESS

Grade 9 Students

- **Grade 8 students who are currently living in all newly constructed residential units are not eligible to register for Earl Haig**
- Grade 8 students currently enrolled in our feeder schools will follow traditional registration procedures for admission to Earl Haig. Working closely with these schools, we will try to ensure that all In-area students have submitted a completed registration form by the due date, February 26th. Registration forms will be distributed through our feeder schools.
- The final responsibility for meeting the deadline remains with the parent/guardian of the student applying for admission.
- Students not meeting the February 26th deadline will be wait-listed. Registration for these students will occur if Earl Haig does not reach enrolment capacity. The wait-list will only include students who registered at Woodbine JHS. Students must inform Earl Haig Secondary School of their intent to attend Earl Haig in September.
- Grade 9 students new to the area must apply for admission by February 26th or they will be wait-listed. They must produce a notarized agreement of purchase and sale OR a notarized lease, plus 2 additional billing proofs of residency.
- Grade 9 students from the newly constructed residential buildings of more than 4 units within this area built after December 2000 will be designated to Woodbine JHS.

Grade 10 to 12 Students New to the Area

- Students who move into existing residential units within this area and who wish to apply for admission to grades 10 to 12, must produce a notarized agreement of purchase and sale OR a notarized lease, plus 2 additional proofs of residency by the due date, February 26th.
- After the February 26th deadline students will be wait-listed. Students must be registered at Georges Vanier S.S. in order to be considered for late registration at E.H.S.S. Students must inform Earl Haig Secondary School of their intent to attend Earl Haig in September.
- Grade 10 to 12 students from newly constructed residential buildings of more than 4 units within this area built after December 2000 will be designated to Georges Vanier S.S.

Students Moving Out of Area

Students who move out of the area or into new developments mid-year and self - identify immediately to the office, may complete the balance of their academic year at Earl Haig, but must register at the home school in their new neighbourhood for September 2010. It is the responsibility of the parent / guardian / student to inform the school if they are moving out of the area.

Students Enrolled who are Out of Area

TDSB will continue to undertake rigorous enrollment audits of students presently registered at Earl Haig Secondary School. Students discovered to be enrolled at Earl Haig S.S. without a legal right to attend, will be identified and **immediately removed** from the rolls at Earl Haig S.S. and directed to their local Secondary School.

** Newly Constructed Residential Units **

Students in grades 9-12 who move into newly constructed residential buildings of more than 4 units within this area built after December 2000 will be directed to schools other than Earl Haig S.S. Students in grade 9 will be directed to Woodbine JHS and students in grades 10-12 will be directed to Georges Vanier S.S.

Claude Watson Arts Program

- Claude Watson students who intend to remain in the program must register by the February 26th deadline along with the Collegiate students.
- Students applying for the program must reside in the Metro Toronto area and should be attending a school within the boundaries of Metro Toronto.
- Admission to the Claude Watson Program is by audition.
- The program is capped at **500** students.
- Gifted and talented students from the TDSB are invited to apply in December 2009 for Dance, Drama, Music, Screen Arts and Visual Arts. Auditions occur in January 2010 for available spaces in September for the following school year 2010-2011.

Optional Attendance

Earl Haig Secondary School will remain **closed** for Optional Attendance.
